

Integrated Eligibility System (IES) Roundtable 12.4.2015

The mission of IES is to enhance the well-being of New Yorkers by transforming health and human service delivery through coordinated business practices, modernized technology, and strategic partnerships. IES will provide eligibility, enrollment, case management, and payment functionality for Health and Human Service programs currently served by the Welfare Management System, Benefits Issuance Control System and other State systems. IES will build on the successful opening of the New York State of Health (NYSoH) by leveraging assets created for the health benefit exchange to modernize the eligibility system for health and human service programs. A solicitation of an IES system integrator will be forthcoming in 2016.

To maintain an open dialog with the vendor community, IES held a roundtable discussion on Friday, December 4, 2015, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., in Nelson A. Rockefeller Empire State Plaza, Albany, New York.

The roundtable was facilitated by the IES Program Director, Ivy Pool. A total of ten representatives from three State agencies and two social service districts served on the panel.
